Remember the ongoing pandemic and keep distance!
There can be new guidelines from authorities and SSF, therefore new information regarding the competition can be published any minute. It is up to the participant to always be updated about the competition.

All the participants, coaches, volunteers and parents have together a responsibility to follow the general guidelines from FHM and the directions from the organizer.

Welcome to the traditional long-distance OnePartnerGroup Ski Marathon Östersund 42 km with start and finish at the Östersund Ski Stadium.

The event is performed in a classic style with mass start and also offers shorter distances such as 19 km, 10 km and 5 km. The longer distances are seeding based races for Vasaloppet and Tjejvasan.

OnePartnerGroup Ski Marathon Östersund 42 km is a part of **SKI CLASSICS CHALLENGERS** and the race is also included in **GÄLLÖ SKOG JÄMTLAND SKI TOUR**, a collaboration between 7 other local long-distance events. More info about the tour in the end of this invitation.

COURSES

Start and finish at the ski stadium. You will leave and return to the area at the field end of the stadium

5 km – follows "hundspåret" and the goes around Rannåstjärn and back up to the stadium..

10 km – same as 5 km but two laps.

19 km – same as 5 km and 10 km but after passing Rannåstjärn it continues away over the ski bridge and up to Torråsen and then goes back through "Jönssonslingorna", over the second bridge and passes the south part of Rannåstjärn, connecting with the course for 5/10 km and back to the stadium.

42 km – beginning with a masterlap about 3 km and then the same course as 19 km but two laps with lapping and finish at the stadium.

Course maps and course profile will be published on the website. A change of course and distance might be done, depending on the current snow situation.

Information about course will be held at 8.00 at the Race office lower floor.

LATE ENTRY

Late entry is possible on site at the Race Office from Saturday Jan 15 Jan at. 16:00-19:00 and Sunday Jan 18 from 07:00 up to 60 minutes before the start. Cancellation is not refundable. Change of name for participant is possible and can be done at Race Office at a cost of EUR 10. Distance changes are made on site without charge. If the competition is canceled, 50 percent of the registration fee will be refunded. Alternatively, if the race is moved to another date, the registration fee is a payment for that date.

RULES FOR THE RACE

The Swedish Ski Association's competition rules apply. Competitors who do not belong to any club or association with insurance participate at their own risk.

Participants must immediately notify race officials if the person if they choose to no finish the race and submit their number bib.

COLD LIMIT

Cold limit is -20°C for adults (21 years and up), -17°C for juniors and -14°C for younger. At a temperature lower than the specified limit values on the day of the competition, the participants are notified at least 2 hours before the start of the advanced start time alternatively setting the competition and a new competition date via the website.

SPECIAL INFORMATION REGARDING THE LONG DISTANCE RACE

Technical control: According to the regulations, participants are prohibited from using skate technique. During the race, only classical technique can be used which must be respected. The organizer will have technical controllers along the course. Violation of the competition rules can lead to extra time or disqualification.

Garbage: We urge all competitors not throwing any used gel and bar packaging along the course. If you need to get rid of the packaging, they should be dropped at the zones where there are garbage cans.

PRACTICAL INFORMATION

Changing rooms: Possibility to change clothes and showers are available in the ground floor of the Media Center Building. Opens at 07:30 on Sunday morning. They are public and we ask that you don't use the to avoid any spreading of covid-19.

Parking: Located next to the stadium between the Race Office Building and the Media Center Building and at Arctura.

Bib distribution: Can be picked up on Sunday Jan 16 from 07:00 at the ski stadium. Place or building when be published later. It is bib and chip that is to be returned after finish.

Participants with their own chip should use the,

Water station: Staffed water zones when lapping at the stadium and one at the finish. In addition, there are personnel out along the course.

RESULTS
