Fluoride control will take place. Info at each team leader meeting (at 18.00 Thursday, Friday and Saturday). Ski marking tags must be attached to the skis. Available in the number bib bag.

RACE BIBS

Pick up per team on the upper floor of the secretariat, in the morning of each race day. If you don't return your number bib, you will be charged 500 SEK.

For sprint heats, a leg number bib must be used, pasted on the **left** leg (done inside, for it to stick).

CHIP

Personal chips are used at all competitions.

Chips are available for rent for 150 SEK/day, for those who forgot their own chip at home.

TEAM CAPTAIN MEETINGS/TCM

Team captain meetings will be held on Thursday, Friday and Saturday at 18:00 digitally via webcast, Teams.

WAXING CABIN

Keys to waxing cabins can be picked up at the competition secretariat, see opening hours above. If the fee has not been paid, payment must be made on site in the secretariat to gain access to the waxing shed. A parking permit is obtained for each cabin.

If you come with waxing buses, you have a parking space adjacent to the waxing cabins.

See the signs in the waxing area.

The return of the key to the waxing cabin must be made in the wallaby to "Janken", after inspection of the cabin. If the key is not returned, SEK 1,000 will be invoiced afterwards. Non-cleaned waxing cabin will be invoiced with SEK 2,000 afterwards.

DRINKING AND COACHING DURING THE RACE COURSE

No special restrictions on drinking, pole dealing and coaching, except at the TV cameras. Info at the team leader meetings. Also, leave a clear line of sight when filming for technique checks. Be considerate of each other and follow the officials' instructions if something arises.

COVERALLS

Cover clothing should be left in the start area.

HEALTH CARE

Ambulatory doctors are available. If necessary, contact the Secretariat. In case of emergency, call 112.

TOILETS

In the changing rooms Mediahuset, outside the secretariat towards the parking lot and 2pcs. inside the café/secretariat.





CHANGING ROOMS

The ground floor of the media building. The large building next to the shooting range.

ATHLETE LOUNGE

First floor of the tower building (old secretariat).

PARKING

Large planes at the Secretariat/Media House. Waxing area is only for those who have booked waxing cabin and have a parking certificate visible in the windscreen.

SALES/SERVING

Catering: On the ground floor of the secretariat, refreshments are sold.

Barbecue sale outdoors.

Lunch service: Restaurant Arctura can be found in the ski stadium area (thermos)
